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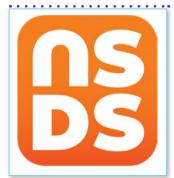

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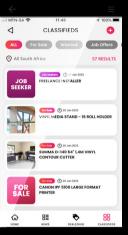

# **Business Saves Costs And Opens New Markets With Midcomp's UV Hybrid** Flatbed And Roll To Roll Printer

Midcomp installed a JHF M3300 UV hybrid flatbed and roll to roll printer at FrontSeat Group. This high precision, super-sized hybrid printer is equipped with Konica Minolta industrial-grade heads, capable of printing multiple layers with flexible white ink.

It adds more versatility to a business as it expands the range of applications for both soft and rigid materials. The JHF M3300 can handle a wide range of applications, such as: vinyl, paper, acrylic, aluminium composite panels, architectural ceramics, decorative flooring, wood, polyester, corrugated board, (high-density) PVC, flexible foam panels, glass and metal (with a primer).

FrontSeat Group has served the signage and branding industry for 20 years, and continues to grow in becoming leaders of signage and branding within the informal market.

FrontSeat Group's signage director, Tshiamo Motshome, discussed how the printer is helping the business: 'We specialise in informal branding, such as spaza branding, car wash branding, taxi rank branding, etc. We mostly use Chromadek as our substrate, so we first print on vinyl, laminate it and then apply it. With the new flatbed printer, we have been able to cut down on both ink. vinyl, lamination and labour costs, saving around R35,000 a month and thereby R420,000 a year on Chromadek signs alone.'

'When we save, our clients also save. We've decreased our printing prices, which gives us a competitive edge. So the machine is beneficial for both us and our clients. Production runs faster since it covers more square metres per hour, and we are cutting down on curing time for the ink and application costs, allowing us to take on more projects,' said Motshome.

The machine also opens new markets for the company. 'Part of the reason we got the machine was to start printing billboard formats. We have our own internal out of home advertising division, and we own over 100 billboard faces across the country, ranging between traditional and taxi rank billboards. We have two other printers that limited us when it came to billboard printing because we would have to outsource our billboard prints. With the JHF M3300 flatbed, we are now expanding our services for our internal division and also saving around R350,000 a year.'

Other product offerings FrontSeat Group will be adding this year include textile printing, which opens doors for branding (i.e. gazebos, flag banners, banner walls, textile/fabric banners etc).

# **Fujifilm South Africa Officially Opens New South African Head Office**

The grand opening of the newly constructed building, located at 18 Holt Street, Sandton, Johannesburg, was attended by several local dignitaries, international Fujifilm management members such as Toshihisa lida – president and CEO Fujifilm Europe – as well as the Japanese ambassador to South Africa, His Excellency, Shigeru Ushio.

The opening of the head office coincides with Fujifilm South Africa's ten-year anniversary celebration in South Africa, having first opened its doors in March 2012 as a subsidiary of FUJIFILM Holdings Corporation.

At 999sqm, the five-storey building incorporates the Fujifilm Technology Centre Africa, office space for employees, boardrooms, a Fujifilm repair centre and a 30-seater auditorium for training purposes.

Teiichi Goto, President, Representative Director and Chief Executive Officer of FUJIFILM Holdings Corporation, during a live video stream at the event said that the company's presence in South Africa is of strategic importance for its future, boosting sales activities over the past ten years. 'To ensure that Fujifilm South Africa continues to be trusted as an integral part of the Southern African community, we will continue to provide solutions to the challenges faced in the region.'

Speaking at the grand opening of the new head office, Fujifilm South Africa's Managing Director, Taro Kawano noted, 'Today is truly a special occasion in the history of Fujifilm since it marks a new chapter in our relationship with South Africa. Our new head office emphasises Fujifilm's ongoing commitment to the country, having celebrated a successful decade of local presence. We are proud to be a part of South Africa and we hope to be able to further serve the public through this new premises'

Importantly, the South African head office was constructed to fall in line with FUJIFILM Holdings' climate action targets: to produce net zero CO2 emissions by the fiscal year ending March 2041. The new office is set to meet this goal, having been designed with the help of a green energy consultant. As such, it incorporates the use of solar power panels with a capacity of 65 kVA, biometric access control, motion sensors, day/night lighting and energy efficient plumbing that consumes less water.

Fujifilm's head office in Johannesburg was designed by Empowered Space Architects and follows the opening of a new Fujifilm office and repair centre in Cape Town during 2021 and the building of the Fujifilm warehouse in Roodepoort in 2017. The offices were constructed by Bantry Construction,



with building taking place from March 2022 through to handover to Fujifilm at the end of January 2023.

Present at the new office is the Fujifilm Technology Centre Africa, which moved from its previous location at the Fujifilm warehouse to the new premises. It is the only Fujifilm Technology Centre on the continent, taking up two floors and providing a demonstration centre for Fujifilm's different departments to showcase a myriad of innovative solutions to customers.

This includes products from Medical Systems (radiography, mammography, pathology, X-ray diagnostics), Graphic Communication (wide format printing, packaging, commercial digital and commercial offset), as well as Imaging Solutions (Instax instant cameras and printers, Fujifilm X-series and GFX mirrorless cameras).

Moreover, a 30-seater auditorium now gives Fujifilm South Africa the opportunity to offer product training to customers, run photography workshops and the ability to host events.

During the opening ceremony, Kawano thanked all parties involved in the process. 'This beautiful building is testament to the hard work of everyone who contributed. It shows what can be achieved through team effort and dedication. Fujifilm South Africa is proud to now be able to better serve our South Africa customers and contribute to their growth,' he stated.

Kawano mentioned that he believes Fujifilm can play a significant part in the future of South Africa, not only through innovative printing and imaging solutions, but also in contributing to African healthcare through Fujifilm's medical technologies. 'At Fujifilm, we say 'Never Stop' innovating for a better world, and now, at (the new Sandton

premises), Fujifilm South Africa can continue to strive towards this goal. We are looking forward to further decades of local success,' Kawano concluded

Grant Potgieter, General Manager of Fujifilm South Africa's Graphic Communication Division, also expanded on the occasion of the event, 'Our rental contract at Woodlands Office Park was getting closer to the end of its period and we had a choice to extend the contract or look at moving elsewhere. We explored the various options and ultimately a decision was made to relocate due to the deal we received on this new premises. The fact that we could design this (new) building to be more in line with our requirements from an office space perspective, as well as the ability to incorporate a larger demonstration facility for Graphics, Medical and our Imaging division, was also a deal clincher.'

'The fact that the space available to build on was in the Sandton area was just purely by design, not intentional, however, we do believe that having our offices and, more so, our technology centre positioned more centrally will be more beneficial, convenient and safer to host customers for open days, events and meetings,' added Potgieter.

'The new facility is greener and in line with our global sustainability initiative. It is fully solar powered and we have a back up generator to cover us in the event of any electricity outages, meaning that our business and demonstration centre can operate 24/7. There is LED lighting throughout the facility as well as automatic on/off switches if we enter a room, conserving electricity. Windows are also double-glazed to manage the temperature within the offices so that there is less requirement to run air conditioners/heaters as seasons change.'

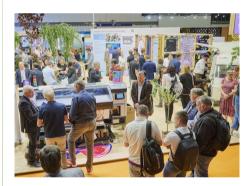

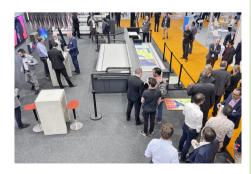

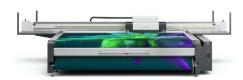

# FESPA Organisers Outline Global Event Portfolio And Exciting Launches



A FESPA press webinar was hosted on Tuesday 28 March, ahead of the upcoming FESPA Global Print Expo, European Sign Expo and Personalisation Experience 2023.

The webinar was presented by Michael Ryan, FESPA's Head of Global Print Expo, who provided updates on events, the exhibitor line-up and the feature programme. He was joined by FESPA's CEO, Neil Felton who provided an overview of FESPA's Corporate activities, the global event portfolio and plans beyond 2023. Duncan MacOwan, FESPA's Head of Marketing Events shared further information on the brand-new Personalisation Experience exhibition space and conference programme.

During the webinar Association Activities were covered, including mention of ARED, a FESPA member that organises a donation campaign for the earthquake zone that took place in Turkey and affected ten provinces. ARED is sending coldresistant tents and containers to the earthquake zone.

Corporate updates included mention of FESPA's online platforms for global access to inspirational and educational content; covering trends, challenges and opportunities in specialty print and sharing best practice examples; and expanding with new sustainability and printerior hubs.

In terms of the FESPA Print Census, 1778 entries from 120 countries were received, with input from members of all its global associations. A topline summary of results will be available at events in Munich and a full report published later this year.

Wrap Fest Silverstone is an all-new event taking place from 26-27 April at Silverstone racing circuit UK with 50 suppliers confirmed, as well as an educational conference and hands-on training sessions, as well as over 80 live wrapping demonstrations.

FLEX (FESPA Leadership Exchange) is a new EMEA exclusive networking event which was hosted in Dubai from 1-2 March, and welcomed 25 of the leading print businesses in the Middle East to facilitate inter-regional knowledge exchange. The

key outcome was feedback on the need for a FESPA event to serve this region.

Also announced was the launch of FESPA Middle East next year. There is a strong appetite for a content-led FESPA event in the Middle East, and the first edition of this brand new annual FESPA event will take place 29-31 January 2024 and will be hosted at the Dubai Exhibition Centre. Over 100 exhibitors are expected and will include a Wrap Masters, a conference programme and a Club FESPA networking area.

FESPA Global Print Expo and European Sign Expo 2023 falls under the theme of new perspectives, encapsulating how, in our constantly evolving specialty print industry, the possibilities are endless, encouraging visitors to look at things from a different angle, to discover fresh approaches and avenues of growth, and to exchange perspectives on the industry with peers to gain different viewpoints.

A new social media video series will be launching – #FESPAMyPerspectives – to encourage the community to share their own opinions on industry themes, vertical markets etc.

Also highlighted was the Sustainability Spotlight, a comprehensive showcase of innovative sustainable textile and graphic substrates. Each substrate will be available to touch and feel and will feature an information card detailing the sustainable attributes of each material.

The FESPA Awards is back for the first time since 2019, and over 210 entries from 34 countries have been received. Shortlisted entries will be showcased in the Atrium in the West Entrance of Messe Munich at FESPA Global Print Expo. Winners will be announced on 24 May.

In terms of World Wrap Masters, the European leg of the competition will take place 23-24 May, with the series final 25-26 May, which will involve wrapping cars as well as surprise objects, and hosting a programme of wrapping workshops and demonstrations, alongside the Wrap Institute.

The new virtual Printeriors microsite is to be hosted on FESPA.com. The online hub will build on the application stories of the products displayed in Printeriors in recent years, with a central hub for educational and inspirational content on interior decor opportunities. Elements of printed interior decor will be on show throughout the exhibition, such as the Club FESPA member networking area.

The FESPA Party Night will be hosted at Pacha in Munich on 25 May, and is an opportunity to

network with community outside exhibition.

Also outlined was The Personalisation Experience, a brand-new event from FESPA and three day conference programme and exhibition space designed for brand owners, retailers, marketers, agencies and membership and loyalty organisations, demonstrating how brands can differentiate their offering with personalisation and customisation, and focusing on print, packaging, interior decor and sportswear/fashion and loyalty marketing.

The organisers anticipate an audience of senior decision makers from all around the world. In years gone by that's been over 120 different nationalities represented, and many from Africa.

For the first time since 2019, FESPA Africa will return to Johannesburg alongside its co-located events, Sign Africa, Africa Print and the Modern Marketing Expo. Hosted in conjunction with FESPA Partner, Practical Publishing, the exhibition will open from 13–15 September 2023 at the Gallagher Convention Centre, connecting visitors with over 150 exhibitors.

# **Agfa Installs Dye-Sublimation**



Lancashire-based trade printer, Super-Wide Digital (SWD) will largely use their new Agfa Avinci engine to produce backlit textile graphics for POS and exhibition work. It is the second Agfa print engine in which SWD has invested.

The new printer will join several dye-sublimation printers at the firm, but it's the first dye-sub purchased from Agfa. Luke Drogan, from SWD explained, 'We took delivery of a Jeti Tauro H3300 LED hybrid wide format press in late 2019 and during Covid it worked 24/7, producing the many miles of social distancing graphics for our customers. It quickly became the production teams favoured print machine, and it was the reliability of the Jeti Tauro that gave us the confidence in the Agfa product. So, when we decided to add another dye-sub machine to cope with the demand of our growing soft signage business, Agfa's Avinci was a key printer to review."

At a time when energy costs have become the number one consideration of most businesses, the dye-sublimation process, with the requirement of a heated calender unit, could be a concern for some. But SWD had the foresight to install solar panels across a large section of their roof in 2016 and February saw three times as many installed on the remaining roof space. This investment, as well as an off-site wind turbine, has meant that they will be fully reliant on their own power generation for the year, providing the business with a very stable foundation.

SWD has a huge arsenal of printers on their Bacup site and they have a policy of consistently investing and updating their equipment so that they have efficient machines using the minimum of power. They will largely use their new Avinci engine to produce backlit textile graphics for POS and exhibition work. They also have large-scale finishing, which is key when dealing with textiles and can often be the bottleneck in the process. But they have the benefit of laser cutting technology on an 8 x 3m bed to heat seal material edges and prevent any woven media from fraying. The business sensibly quotes lead times based on their capability of output from their finishing department as opposed to press lead times.

The Avinci CX3200 3.2m wide dye-sublimation roll-to-roll printer can print both directly to textile

and to transfer paper at a speed of up to 250sqm per hour. Requiring offline fixation, it provides flexibility and reduced waste. It's also much more energy-efficient and features Agfa's 'Thin-Ink-Layer technology' resulting in very low ink consumption.

Drogan added, 'It's been an interesting and challenging few years in business, first with Covid, then the fall in supplies, and now the cost of living and energy crisis. As a business we have looked at a wider investment plan to help us through the turbulence and the resulting solar power and wind turbine will help us significantly this year. We are also trying to navigate through potential 'greenwashing' in the industry to focus on truly sustainable products and materials. Strong relationships with suppliers who have the same values are key to our business and our relationship with Agfa is growing. We are already impressed with the results of the Avinci. There is a robustness and consistency to their machines which means we can run them confidently. We are already talking about investing in more Agfa machines and I'm sure that with the benefit of their finance package, this will be a reality very soon.'

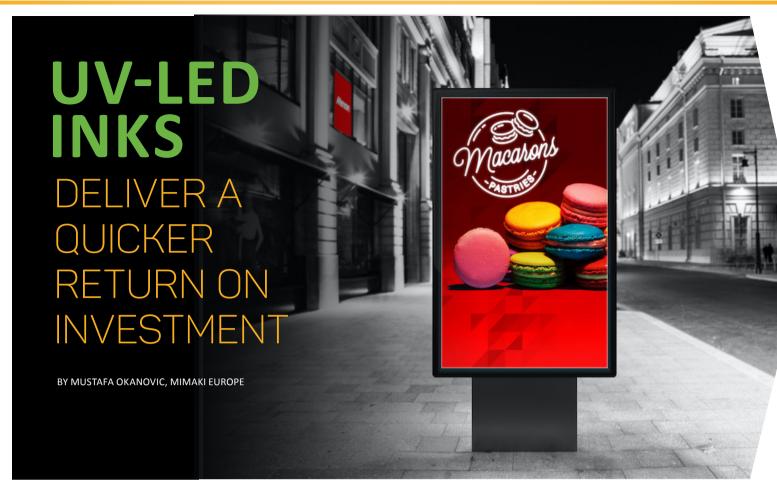

As with any recurring investment, inks are an important factor to look at when investing in a printer or press, especially for large-scale operations. Not only do the recurring costs add up, but so do the CO2 emissions.

In order to maximise profits and keep CO2 emissions low, it is important for the printer to create added value, be versatile in its applications and for the ink to be good value to begin with. So, considering UV-LED and Latex printers, which is a more beneficial investment?

# UV LED or Latex printing – what is the difference?

Latex inks are water based pigmented inks containing small particles of latex, which is a form of plastic. Once applied to a product, heat is used to evaporate the water, leaving the pigment and latex particles behind. On the other hand, UV-LED inks are not water based, and instead rely on specially designed UV lights following the printheads to dry the substrate.

# Weighing up the benefits:

## 1. Sustainability

Increasingly, sustainability is becoming an important detail, as European goals (www.sdgs.un.org/goals) push industries to reduce CO2 emissions. Both UV-LED and Latex inks have their pros and cons in this area. When we look at the process as a whole, there is a clear sustainable winner.

UV-LED inks require up to nine times less energy throughout the printing process than Latex inks (according to Mimaki's internal evaluation), due to Latex inks' water-based composition requiring an additional curing and drying process. Latex printers need to have an accompanying curing heater, and unlike products created with UV-LED ink, cannot be taken to the post-processing machine before being properly dried by a curing heater.

This means that the whole process takes much longer, making it more

inconvenient, costly and less eco-friendly. Some printing technology manufacturers, such as Mimaki, have created Latex inks that cure at low temperatures to address this issue and minimise energy consumption. However, across the board, UV-LED inks cure instantly with a fraction of the energy needed by Latex, resulting in huge energy savings and up to ten times less CO2 emission than Latex printing.

In terms of safety, both inks are safe to use after curing. Latex inks have the advantage due to their water-based composition, which UV-LED inks compensate for with reduced VOC emissions.

#### 2. Cost-effectiveness

There is a clear stand-out contender here, as UV-LED printers have a lower initial investment and UV-LED inks cost less per litre compared to Latex inks. Combined with up to three times lower ink consumption compared to Latex, the use of UV-LED printers can make a significant difference in sales margins and profits.

Proving its versatility, UV-LED curing technology does not produce any heat and so does not limit the range of materials that can be used. Compared to Latex, which allows the use of only heat-resistant, often expensive materials, UV-LED prints successfully even on the cheapest materials, without the need for a special coating. Luxury and highly profitable glossy or matt applications can also be created with UV-LED transparent inks, specially designed for printing in multi-layer technology, by printing with colour or white inks at the same time.

Reducing wastage is an effective way to both cut down on costs and reduce environmental impact. UV-LED inks are a better choice here as well, as they waste 17% less ink than their Latex counterparts, largely due to less flushing



being required during and between print jobs using UV-LED technology. UV-LED piezo printheads last much longer compared to Latex printheads, which must be replaced after only 1.5 litres of ink have been used.

# 3. Output quality

Although colour vibrancy is where Latex printing comes out on top, the overall quality and clarity of details such as skin tones and fine print details, as well as colour matching on repeat orders, are undoubtedly on the UV-LED printer side. Unique technologies have enabled reduced graininess and harsh tonal jumps, helping to create a realistic photo-quality image.

When it comes to durability, thanks to unique curing technologies, UV-LED inks have superior scratch resistance. Often, UV-LED printed applications, such as floor graphics, can be used immediately after printing without any post-processing, unlike Latex inks, which always require lamination for outdoor or frequently scratched applications – further reducing time and additional spend needed to create a final product.

#### The conclusion

Ultimately, different PSPs will prioritise different factors when choosing their printer, and depending on the applications they wish to print, their requirements will differ. Latex can create more vibrant colourful applications, and for those printers who only work with a limited number of materials, this could be the one. However, UV-LED technology clearly leads the way in terms of sustainability, cost-effectiveness, flexibility, scratch resistance and quality. With this combination of benefits, UV-LED ultimately delivers a quicker return on investment.

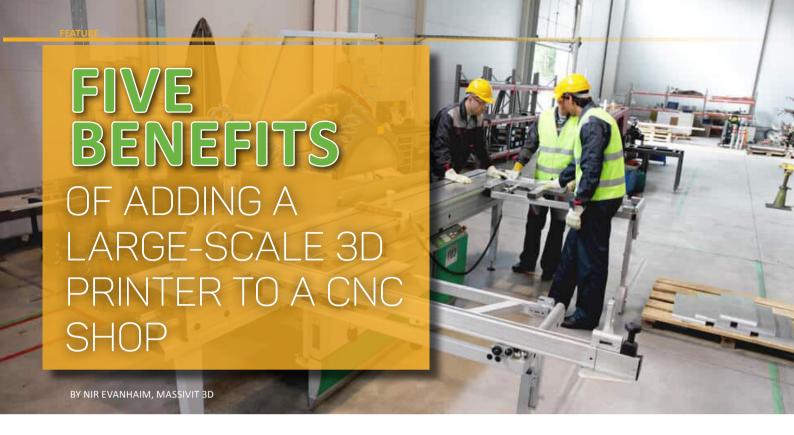

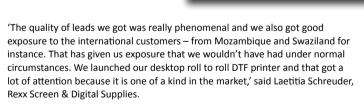

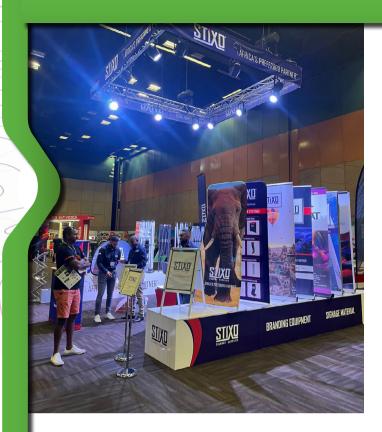

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# HOW TO BECOME

A BETTER BOSS

If you asked your employees to rate you and your performance as a boss, how do you think you would do? Probably not as well as you would like. Why? Because, for most of us, it's easy to critique and criticise others while ignoring our own shortcomings.

Most bosses have been promoted to their positions without having any training in how to manage people. That lack of training is a roadblock to motivating and retaining employees. Studies show that most employees leave their jobs not because of money but because they don't like or respect their bosses. And, when you have to replace them with new people, you incur the cost of training these new people. So, if it's the bottom line that concerns you and your company, you'd do well to pay attention to how you manage your people.

Six steps to improve your performance as a boss:

Make employees feel wanted, needed and valued. When they feel that, they will also feel secure and supported. They will work better with their customers and co-workers. They will make more empowered decisions, and they will be unafraid to take risks. Consistent and continued training and professional development will help your employees refine their skills, discover new areas of interest, and boost their self-esteem and confidence to exceed expectations.

It's imperative that you communicate with your employees and that you do so honestly and openly. Let them know what you expect of them and ask what you can do to help them accomplish their goals. Too often, the only time bosses communicate with employees is when they point out a negative. It's much more important to identify what your employees are doing right, and to recognise their achievements, because doing so motivates them to do more and to do better.

Be a coach. Provide employees with the training and tools they need to do their jobs. If you were coaching an athletic team, you would make sure your players had the proper equipment and training to help them perform well. You would also have a game plan that brings team members together in working toward

a common goal: success. An effective coaching strategy is not one-size-fits-all. The most successful coaches in any industry know that they need to adjust their styles on a per-employee basis to get the most out of everyone.

Identify each employee's unique skills and personality traits. Once you understand your employees, their strengths, their skills and what they desire, you can work strategically to position and motivate them to perform at their best. Let your employees know that you are invested in them and in seeing that they succeed.

Provide constructive and goal-oriented feedback. Give employees in-person feedback that is timely, objective, specific and knowledgeable, and direct and detailed. That feedback is the most important way you can affect employee performance. Address both what employees are doing well and where they could be doing better. Then work together to develop a plan that will get them where you need them to be in their performance.

Do what you say you are going to do. Delivering on your promises, whether it be instituting a new training programme or scheduling a one-on-one meeting, shows employees you value them. It also increases their loyalty to you and your company. When you keep your promises, it builds trust. If your employees don't trust you, they won't do well by you.

As a boss, your goal should be to create an environment where your employees understand that you are there to serve them. You are there to provide them with the resources they need to do their jobs well and to succeed.

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Industry and science leads the way in all sectors, including printing and publishing, where we have seen impressive advances in energy efficiencies and consumables recyclability. But technology is only part of the solution to our climate crisis.

The much bigger part is the part that requires organisations to work together on cutting emissions. It's generally agreed that the planet is in dire shape and that more needs to be done to cut emissions.

This takes working across and within supply chains to improve the sector's environmental profile. But we still too often operate in silos, where the paper industry keeps its own council and printers are preoccupied with getting the next orders out the door. The space for information sharing and cooperation is dominated by industry associations and trade fairs which still do not talk to one another often enough.

The Sustainability Industry Forum recently established in the UK by the UK's Independent Publishers Guild is an excellent example of how things might be different. The Sustainability Industry Forum is an idea that other countries might also want to consider. The objective is for leading trade associations to agree and coordinate plans for cutting environmental impacts.

An industry forum brings together different industry associations. Together they can work together on common projects, reduce duplication and share best practise, in a transparent and accountable way. In the UK there are six current Sustainability Industry Forum participants, including the leading book and publishing associations.

The UK group has a central steering committee of 12 plus a chairman. Together they are responsible for agreeing the purpose of the group, its objectives and scope for actions. The group meets every quarter and is setting up various working groups to consider environmental impact improvements in supply chains including transportation and the use of plastics, end of life, paper and printing, and finishing and embellishments.

This is a laudable effort, but to really make a difference, a Sustainability Industry Forum really does need to include representatives from the whole supply chain. Printing and finishing industry associations have much to contribute to the discussion as do paper and recycling folks. Let's hope the core group of six adds members and that other countries take up the idea.
