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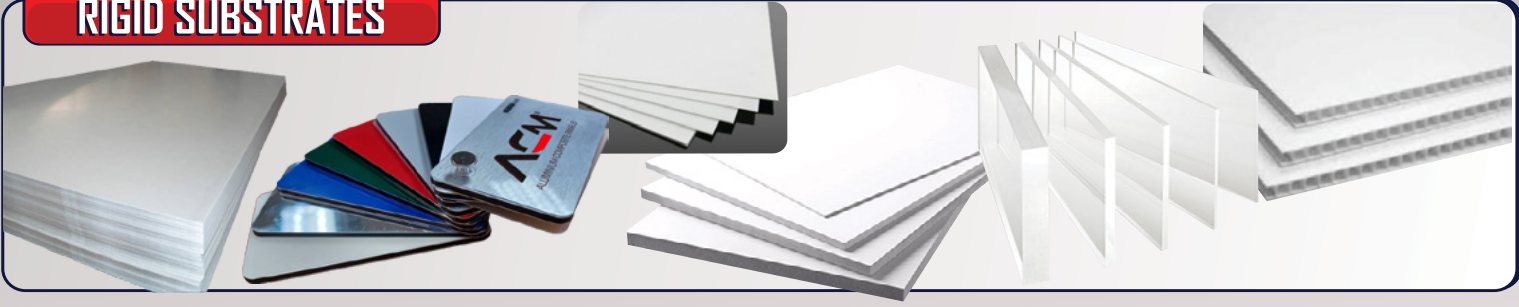

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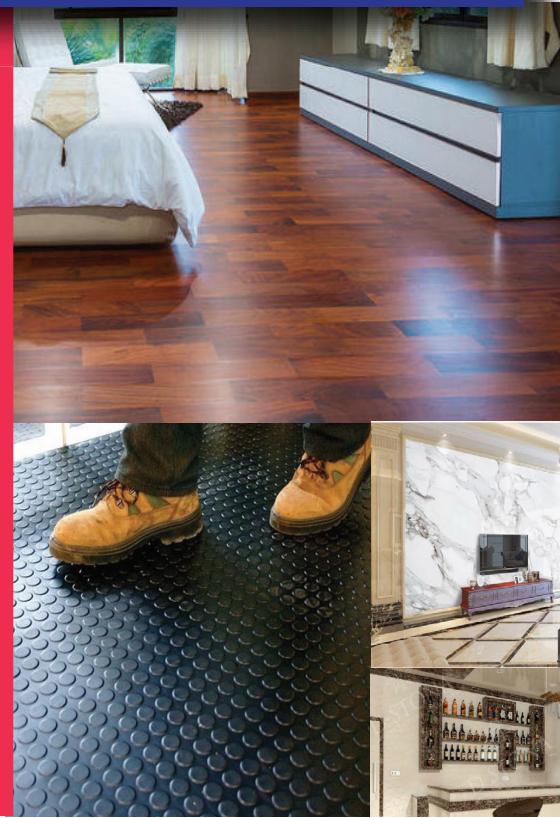
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# EDITOR'S NOTE

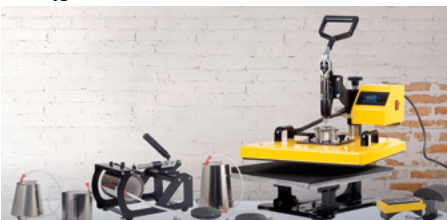

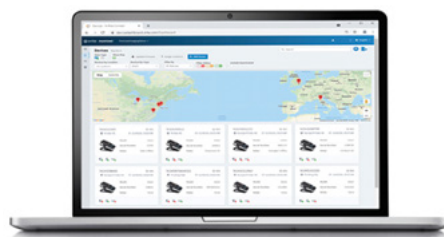

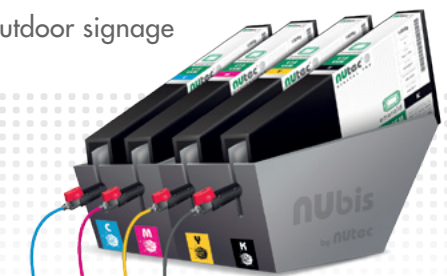

### Wi Corporation

Wi Corporation is owned by Ian and Amelia Krämer, and was started in 2010 as a small independent supplier company with the focus on sublimated

sportswear clothing. They are currently using the Mimaki TS55-1800 and Mimaki JV 150-160.

The company changed their focus in 2011 and registered as a manufacturing company. Wi Corporation then decided to open a sporting goods store, focusing on delivering their product directly to the public, and creating more jobs. Soon after, they had the opportunity to start manufacturing their clothing for Ringball South Africa.

Doors then started opening in the supply and manufacturing of school clothing. By the end of 2018, the company received their first sole manufacturing contract on sublimated school wear, which includes athletics, rugby, cricket, hockey and netball.

In 2019, they had the opportunity to work with Jacques Gombault, resulting in their own range of pencil cases and book bags being started. They also started manufacturing their own school festival range like children's wallets, pavilion cushions, lanyards, bags, sublimated mugs and stationery. Today, Wi Corporation is a multifunctional manufacturing company.

In 2020, they supplied more than one million material masks to hospitals, schools and the general public. Wi Corporation are registered as an 'essential service' company, and are still manufacturing face masks and buffs, and supply sanitisers and thermometers.

Furthermore, they started their own camo range and Afrikaans novelty T-shirts line (BOKDROL), and have their own brands of sublimated clothing lines.

### Canvas and More

The company was founded by husband and wife team Taryn and Jeremy De Goede in Cape Town in their garage five years ago, and has since grown into one of South Africa's largest canvas print manufacturers. They were approached by one of GSW's sales consultants, who demonstrated how much money they could save by using their printers. A few additional products have been launched since then (thanks to GSW), such as banners, posters, wallpaper, vinyl decals and personalised photo puzzles.

So far, Canvas and More have purchased two large format printers from GSW, the new JV100-160 and the CJV150-160, which they use for their print and cut solutions. They intend on upgrading their entire fleet of printers to Mimaki over the next 12 months. All of their printers run continuously 24 hours a day, but sometimes they get weekends off.

### Ripple Screen Printers

After having tried and tested opposition brands, Ripple Screen Printers opted for something new. The company's Allan and Keith Govender welcomed GSW's invitation to showcase its brand and advanced technology, print qualities and capabilities. This, combined with GSW's quick service on delivery and its assistance of Ripple in being able to rapidly secure the finance needed, sold them on the idea of replacing their previous brand with GSW's offerings.

With their first TS300P-1800 and within a space of six months, they were able to grow business capacity and therefore purchased another two machines, of which one is a TX300-1800 (direct to cotton) printer, and they are striving to reach another five machines. With the great service and quick tech assistance, they are certain that this will be attained soon.

The company is extremely proud of having become a Mimaki client and look forward to building on this relationship going forward. Being a Disney approved company, its customers are without a doubt confident in its prints and service as these machines also give them a faster turnaround with very little technical errors and downtime.

The company thanked Mimaki for a well-designed machine and more so for the team behind the brand.

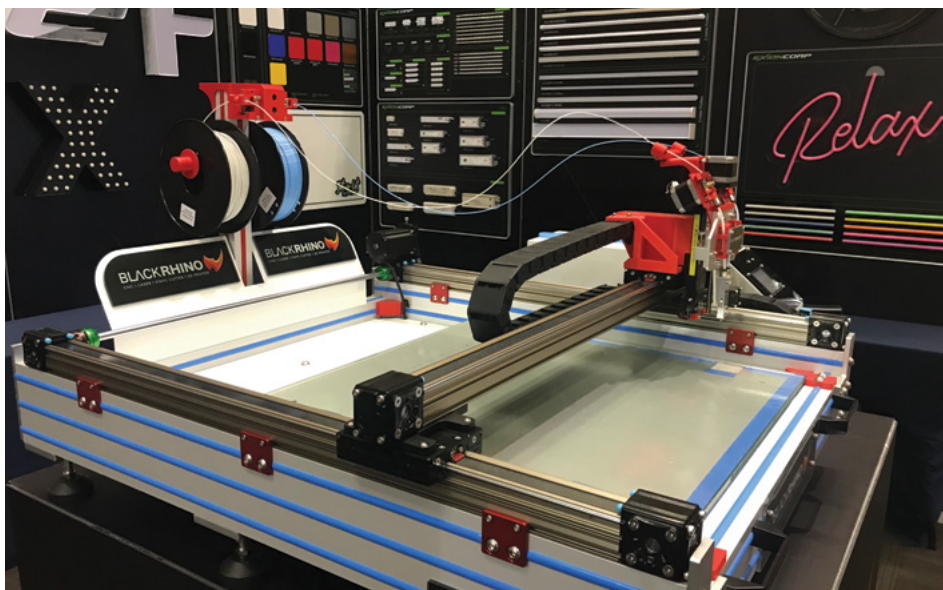

'Other challenges that needed to be overcome included Covid restrictions on the completion of end user specifications with limited access to facilities, reduced advertising and the move to

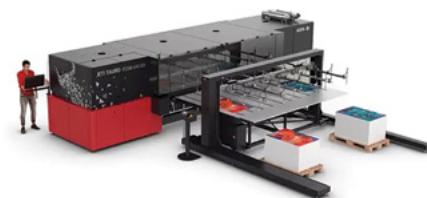

Among Whitby Tool and Plant Hire's fleet of hardworking site assets there's a particular dumper truck that now, thanks to its owners' inventiveness,

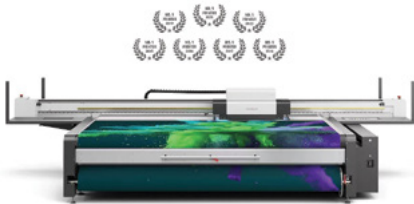

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# THREE P'S

## THAT SHOULD FORM THE BASIS OF HOW A BUSINESS ENGAGES WITH CUSTOMERS

**The pandemic has been the most challenging experience of our lifetime. As the dust settles and we begin to emerge out of the haze of lockdowns and uncertainty, opportunity knocks on the horizon. The global economy's recovery is predicted to occur at an accelerated pace than initially expected, so many businesses are desperate to take advantage and make up for lost time (and sales).**

To grab these opportunities, though, a change in mindset needs to take place, according to Canon South Africa Managing Director, David Preston. Professionalism is the second P, and it's directly linked to proactivity. 'As a business, it is important to be professional in the face of adversity and to keep emotions in check,' Preston explained. 'Sometimes, customers experience challenges with a business and their responses might be emotional due to frustration or the lack of communication.' If businesses are to truly become customer-centric at all touchpoints, Preston added, they need to have the mindset of changing a negative experience into a positive one through their

communication skills and proactive approach, rather than through emotional reactions.

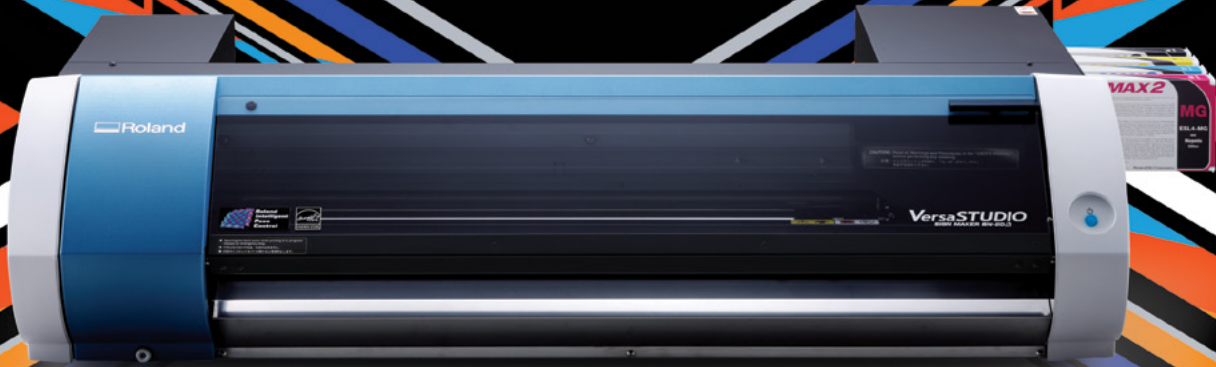
'Professionalism also means adding value within our internal and external teams,' Preston said. 'We need to understand our products and the markets we sell into, so that we add real value to partners and customers. If they are not sure about something, rather double-check and ask the necessary questions for a better understanding of the situation.'

Preston believes that if a business follows the first two P's, the final one, performance, will come naturally. 'By all of us buying into the values and working together, we are capable of building a collaborative spirit and can-do culture that will have a direct impact on success and performance, which will be seen through the increased sales and satisfied customers,' he said. 'This, in turn, allows a business to invest in itself going forward, recruit more talent and to promote and reward its people.'

In conclusion, Preston stressed that performance can only be achieved if proactivity and professionalism are in place from the start. With the marketplace being highly competitive and with similar products and services all aimed at the same customer base, the only way to stand out from competitors is in the core values and how businesses conduct themselves, both internally and externally. 📌

Initial tack or wet grab, shear strength, optical clarity, colour, permanent or removable characteristics, temperature and solvent resistance all need to be considered when designing a custom tape or adhesive to a specific customer application. If the wrong adhesive is chosen, it can lead to product failures that can damage the reputation of the customer's final product.

With that in mind, what should companies look out for when selecting adhesive materials for work? First and foremost, you need to consider the quality of the product you will be working with and the reputation of the manufacturer that supplied the material. As is the case with all kinds of material, you get what you pay for, and opting for cheaper, less-known brands can be a bit of a risk.

Next, do some research into the type of technical support you will get from the tape manufacturer. Not only is the adhesive choice important for the final product, but the other components play just as significant a role.

The adhesive carrier and release liner, if required, are critical for the overall performance of the tape throughout the manufacturing process, from coating the material, to the converting or fabrication of the product to the final use of the tape in the manufactured component.

Finally, consider the level of post-sales customer support you are likely to receive from the tape manufacturer. Once the tape is produced and sold, customers need the proper level of support to ensure that they receive their product on time, every time. 📞

# DIGITAL OUT-OF-HOME ADVERTISING CONTINUES TO RISE

**Out-of-home advertising (OOH) has evolved significantly in recent years and has become a cost-effective solution for reaching consumers both nationally and locally. OOH and more specifically, digital out-of-home, is providing brands with the confidence and data to support their media plans.**

OOH was once limited to billboards, subway posters and other static signage that limited results, made it difficult to measure and accurately target a specific audience.

This may have worked for big-budget movies or giant fast-food chains with locations around every corner, but it did little to satisfy the promotional needs of evolving businesses. Consumer brands have always needed a more powerful tool to amplify their products, and now OOH has caught up to their needs.

OOH has evolved significantly in recent years and has become a cost-effective solution for reaching consumers on both a national and a local scale. This evolution was no doubt further influenced by the global pandemic, significant weather occurrences and ongoing supply chain kinks that have turned our world upside down. However, the change began long beforehand.

Like most forms of advertising, OOH has gone digital, providing brands with the ability to better target consumers with relevant messages and accurately measure results. Digital out-of-home can be deployed programmatically to reach audiences at contextually relevant moments, with dynamic ad placement driven by real-time data.

Weather conditions and the time of day can be set as automatic triggers for ads, as well as the proximity to desired locations. This allows brands to customise for local markets while achieving a national scale and, when combined with other tactics such as social media, promotions and any other audience-based channel, OOH effectively becomes a true omnichannel vehicle.

With the right technology partner, brands can use DOOH to successfully promote products even if they are not equally available everywhere. For example, if a brand is launching a new line of frozen pizzas – first in select markets, then nationally – the brand could use DOOH to approach each market accordingly.

One may require a promotion indicating that the pizzas are available now while another may need to highlight that the new line is coming soon. Technology makes it possible to quickly adjust based on different areas, postal codes or even audiences so that overall messages resonate at a local level. A planning process that once took weeks can now take minutes and results can be measured with different metrics such as attributable sales and foot traffic.

## Target more accurately, respond in real time

The audience here is critical. While OOH may have once been widely used by entities with large budgets, such as automotive or entertainment, brands now have far more access to high performing ad space as well as flexibility and control. DOOH leverages advanced audience targeting to allow brands to reach certain people with specific behaviours or habits instead of solely targeting based on streets and corners. That said, traditional OOH is still very popular – but there is much more fluidity to match traditional and DOOH placements for maximum impact. Marketers can use programmatic buying to complement existing DOOH plans by extending traditional buys or streamlining unique creative treatments.

One of the best parts of DOOH is that it can be executed very quickly. A brand might have thousands of postal codes in mind with the goal of applying Creative A in one market, Creative B in another and so on. There may be different versions of the campaign that need to reach different areas, sharing different messages depending on the market. This could take a team weeks to deploy with direct buys. The back and forth with vendors and proposals could bog down the entire campaign or force the brand to simplify the strategy. Programmatic technology streamlines the process, allowing brands to be nimble and even react to changes in real time.

## 2022 is the year for out-of-home

Ongoing technological advancements are empowering brands to do more with their out-of-home campaigns. They can better target specific markets and more accurately measure the results to determine the campaign's effectiveness.

Most significantly, DOOH has now become a cost-effective way to achieve a national scale while providing the flexibility to customise at the local level and while also responding to last-minute changes. These are just a few of the benefits of DOOH and some of the many reasons why 2022 will be the year out-of-home shines.

# DIGITAL TEXTILE PRODUCTION NEEDS THE RIGHT COMMERCIAL INFRASTRUCTURE FOR ON DEMAND FASHION

**The most risky and revolutionary of the many options for print service providers, when it comes to business diversification, is the move into bespoke apparel manufacturing.**

It is risky because there is no hard evidence that consumers are willing to move en masse away from an environmentally hostile production chain model. This model is entirely built around bulk quantities of sourced materials turned into garments in huge volumes. The result is cheap and lovely clothes made from a variety of fibres, blends and fabrics. The shift to garment microfactories away from the bulk model enables on demand production of garments close to their points of purchase. But will this model really reshape the face of fashion?

Plenty of digital printing system manufacturers think that it will, and hope that the fashion industry will embrace an on demand model to get its sector's emissions down. Microfactories could help cut the emissions and waste associated with bulk manufacturing. They could also help fashion get even faster, so that designers and brands can deliver more than a handful of collections every year. We could move away from fashion's seasonal tyranny to a model that responds to events rather than the season.

There is lots to like in this model, particularly the access it gives young designers to the market. We still need the fabrics to be produced but if they can be digitally printed with patterns and designs, enormous amounts of water can be saved. Producing garments close to market, via online sales, also saves on the emissions associated with transportation, warehousing and inventory management. The relationship between designer and customer is direct and intimate and only those clothes for which there is a buyer are produced. At least in theory.

Unhooking the fashion industry from its traditional framework will take more than good intentions and high ideals, particularly in developed markets such as the USA and Europe. However in places where the garment industry still has room to grow, digital textile printing could have real and realisable scope for

growth, creating a market for new fashion that reflects local expectations and realities. The savings in resources can be impressive, but cutting waste and the dumping of used clothing has perhaps greater environmental impact potential, particularly since it offers opportunities for local business development in remote regions.

Digital textile production also has considerable capacity for scale, a more likely scenario in the West. What is still needed is the right commercial infrastructure for on demand fashion, high quality printing on a wider substrate range, marketing to consumers and of course education within existing supply chains. That should be the goal of all manufacturers hoping to push on demand digital textile and garment manufacture from Canon, Durst, EFI and HP through to Seiko Epson. There's a lot at stake.

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## Master plans for the print industry value chain

According to Dr Abdool Majid Mahomed, CEO of Printing SA, a master plan is a comprehensive plan of action and is used as a tool to define coordinated activities (policies, programmes, etc.) that align with a common set of goals for industries (as determined by stakeholders). It relies on empirical evidence to galvanise stakeholders around a common understanding of challenges/opportunities, followed by the defining of a vision and the development of an action plan to address these challenges. The masterplan then 'lives' through the action plan – which is monitored and evaluated as part of a structured, institutionalised process.

### Why are master plans required and how are they developed?

Masterplans facilitate investment across the value-chain, unlock job creation, deepen cross-sector linkages, encourage optimal industry growth and identify domestic, regional and global export opportunities.

A masterplan is developed by:

- Comprehensively reviewing the South African value chain's present position and policies.
- Completing an industry Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) analysis, and drawing lessons from international successes.
- Developing policy and regulation recommendations for government.
- Proposing programmes for collective action (industry, government and labour).

### Who facilitates master plans?

If the industry falls under the category of manufacturing, then the Department of Trade Industry and Competition (DTIC) is the responsible department, if under culture, then it is the Department of Sport, Arts and Culture (DSAC), if tourism then it is the Department of Tourism (DT), and if agri-processing or cannabis then it is the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (DFFE), etc.

In many instances, the Department Of Small Business Development (DSBD) also gets involved, because small business makes a huge impact on growth and employment across all sectors and industries.

### How does a master plan get developed?

A lead government department identifies a Sector Masterplan Working Group (with representatives from the private sector, government and labour) and various leads who kickstart the process.

This process will include identifying an Industry Reference Group, an Executive Oversight Committee, identification of an appropriate Service Provider and their appointment, and then developing a roadmap having key milestones to be achieved. It takes from one to five years for a plan to be developed and implemented. The targets set can be a long-term time frame of 10 to 20 years ahead.

Progress on each master plan is reviewed regularly by the Presidency's office. Over 20 master plans are currently underway, and about five are completed and in their implementation phase.

Master plans impact positively on job creation and growth of the sector in general. Government's policies are attuned to ensure they drive the attainment of the targets set, resulting in a win-win for all stakeholders.

### What progress has been made with the master plans in the print value chain?

The Creative sector master plan project began about three years ago, consisting of four subsectors:

1. Music and Performing Arts.
2. Publishing and Printed Media.
3. Audiovisual and Interactive Media.
4. Visual Arts, and Craft and Design.

This master plan is managed by DSAC and DSBD, and is now in its final stages, reviewing the skills shortages and specific training programmes that need to be developed/rolled out. Printing SA has given input in the publishing (newspapers and magazines) and printed media (books) sub-plan, one of the four key sectors identified.

The Pharma sector master plan (headed the Pharma Desk of the DTIC) is now calling for companies to volunteer to serve on its various sub-committees. This opportunity will be of interest to packaging companies manufacturing



pharmaceutical packaging and inserts. Printing SA's communication to members asked for volunteers to come forward and make a meaningful impact to this plan through active engagement.

Dr Mahomed said that while both of the above master plans address some aspects of the full value chain of print, Printing SA feels strongly that there is a need for a more comprehensive plan, including all kinds of printing (not only publishing), packaging, signage and the visual communications sectors.

The print value chain master plan was first mooted to the DTIC on 3 September 2021, and Printing SA were then asked to present to the Steering Committee at the National Priority Sectors Master Plans Meeting, that is coordinated by the Presidency's office, on 28 October 2021. There was an agreement in principle that the need for this master plan was well founded, and both the DTIC and DSBD were instructed to set up the first meeting with key stakeholders, government, private sector, the unions and Printing SA as an industry association, which has not occurred to date.

### The way forward

Printing SA are currently seeking advice on how to proceed on this, with engagements with the Presidency's office and Minister Patel's office being pursued.

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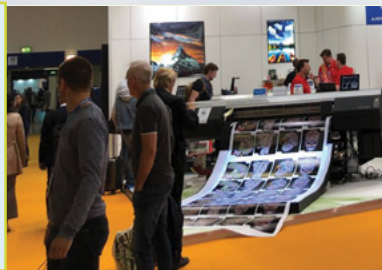

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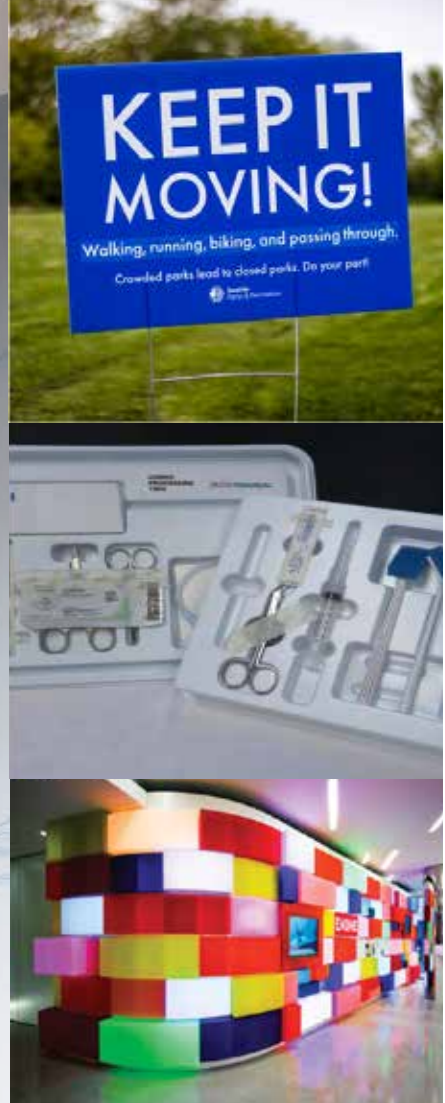
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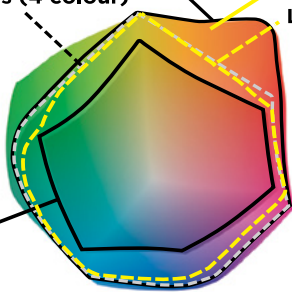


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
